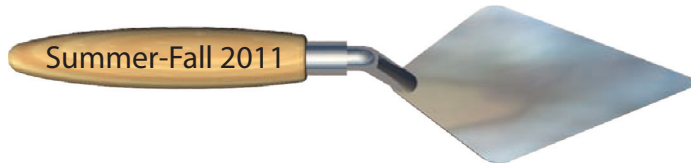

Winter Update

We have successfully moved part of the lab operations to the James Lee Center (JLC) in Falls Church. We are enjoying the extra space and resources. The crew now spends a couple of days at JLC cataloging artifacts. The rest of the week they return to Colchester for field-work. Dirty artifacts remain at the Colchester basement lab where they are washed, dried and sorted prior to transport to JLC. Volunteers are now welcome at JLC on Wednesdays from 9 to 3 and continue to be welcome in the Colchester basement lab on Thursdays, Fridays and most Saturdays from 9 to 3. The lab schedule is a work in progress, but we will keep you informed as changes occur.

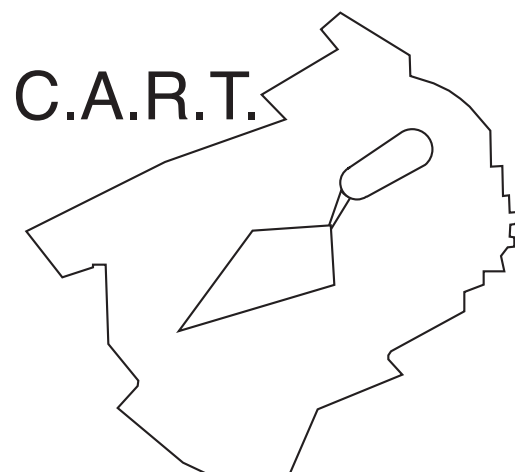
The second of our two historic transcription orientations took place this past Monday, so we have five new volunteers that are working with us on this collaboration with Mount Vernon. We are transcribing ledgers from the Colchester store. If you'd like to become involved, drop us a line!

The Prehistoric Crew has finished the last of the units along the river, and will be working to set up units on the Finger Ridges. We will be there for the next month or so, identifying and delineating sites. It's a significantly longer walk to and from these areas, so be prepared to hike over varied terrain in colder weather. These sites were last visited in early Spring, and yielded interesting finds and seemingly intact stratigraphy. We are excited to finally be returning, especially in this beautiful Fall weather. Let's hope it lasts!

The Historic Crew continues work on 44FX0704, and are discovering new features and interesting artifacts including the "TD" tobacco bowl and a wine bottle seal probably belonging to the original landowner for the whole area. We are finishing up some units on the town site (44FX3197), and will focus on the large stone foundation originally discovered by GMU in the 1980's. Further excavation on the foundation hopefully will reveal more mysteries of the town and its occupants. Volunteers are welcome to join us at 44FX0704 on Thursdays and Fridays and at 44FX3197 on Saturdays.

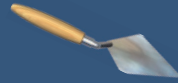

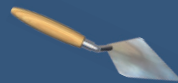

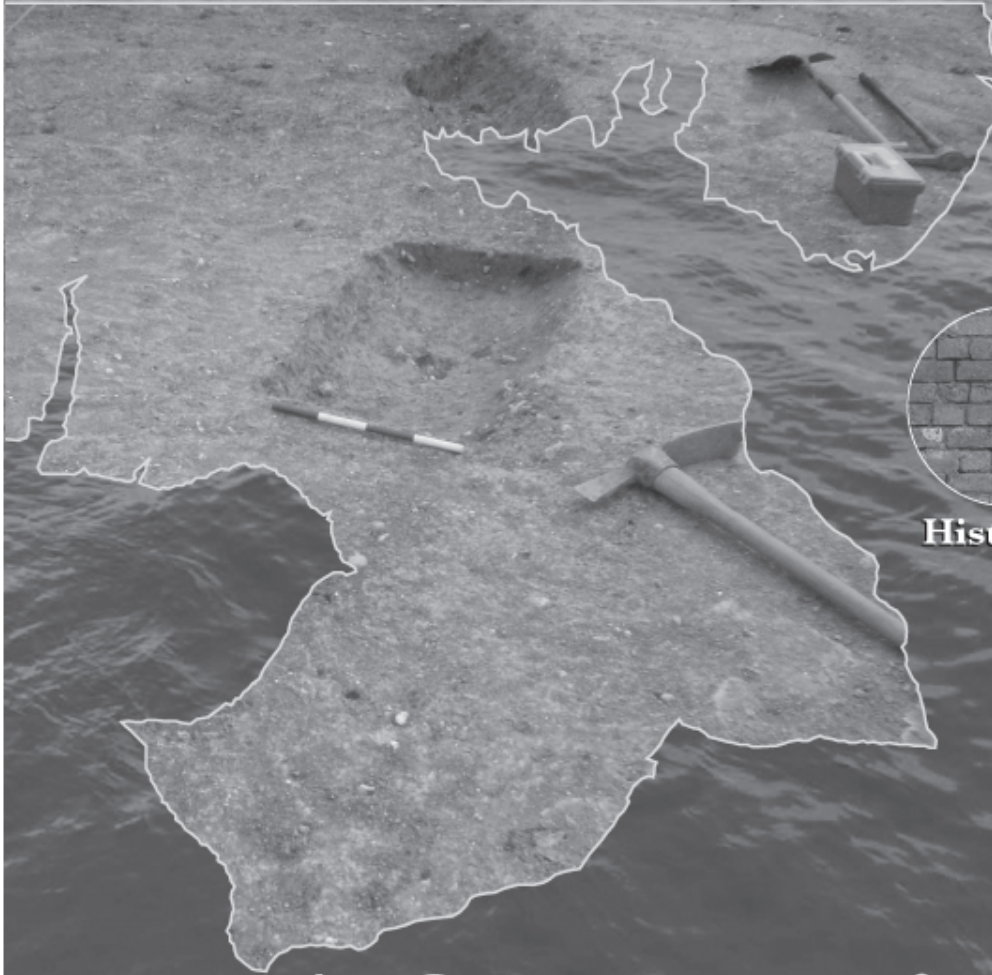
