

Please join us on Saturday November 15th, for a presentation by Dr. Stephen Potter, the Regional Archaeologist for the National Capital Region of the National Park Service. His talk will focus on the relationships between the Algonquian-speaking peoples of the Potomac River Valley, who in 1607, were not only embroiled in their own alliances and squabbles, but were linked with other peoples through a complex web of trade, alliances, and conflict that stretched far beyond the banks of the Potomac. This tumultuous native political landscape affected the development of relations with the invading Europeans and the course of colonial and imperial powers in the region from the Great Lakes to the Virginia Capes. A combination of archaeological, ethnohistorical, and historical data provide the foundation for new perspectives on the critical sixty years following the establishment of Jamestown.

The presentation is open to all who wish to attend. The FOFA Membership Meeting will be held following the presentation.
